The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) has partnered with the City and Borough of Juneau to study a possible transportation corridor to connect Juneau with the north end of Douglas Island. A connection has been studied since the 1980s but has not progressed beyond identification and recommendation of preliminary alternative alignments. The previous studies highlighted several reasons for a north crossing:

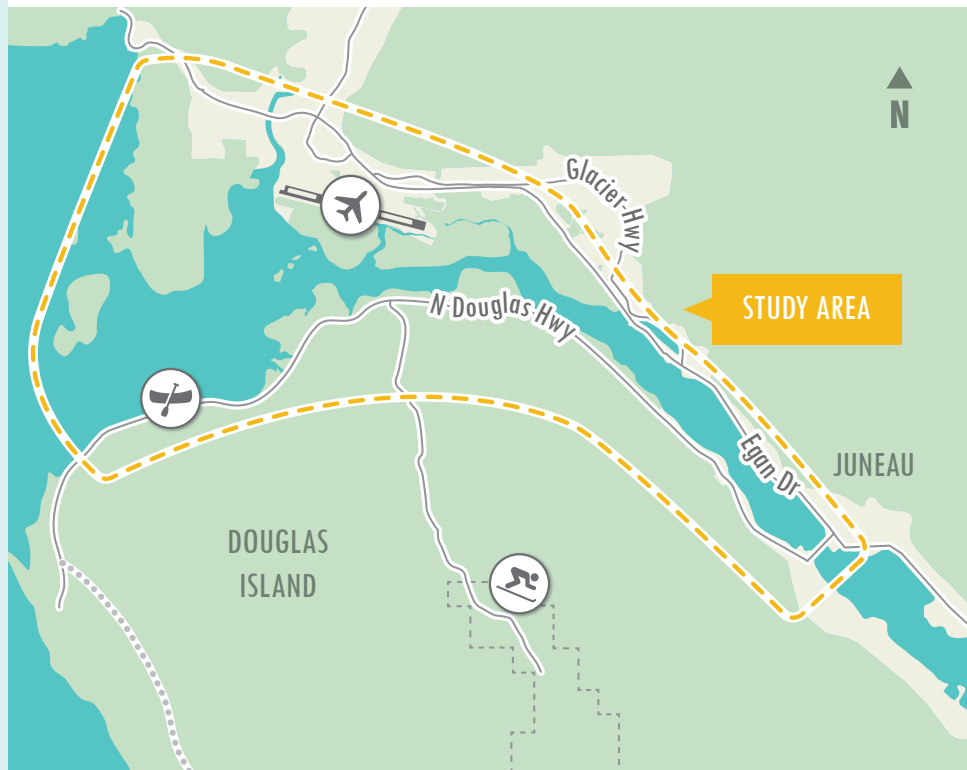
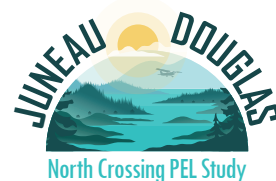
- Congestion during peak periods on the existing Douglas Island Bridge
- Concerns about safety and emergency response in the event of a bridge closure
- The potential for residential, commercial, industrial and port development at west Douglas Island

DOT&PF has chosen the Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) process to identify and evaluate a purpose and need for connecting Juneau with Douglas Island.

Join us to learn more about the PEL Study process, provide feedback on the existing conditions in the area, and give us your thoughts on the draft purpose and need. This is the first of three open house meetings planned during the PEL Study.
